



Each year, between 180 and 200 high school students from the Los Angeles area which defines Rotary International District 5280 meet for 2 ½ days and participate in a variety of activities:

Multiple Paul Harris Fellows receive pins with additional stones. Recognition levels are based on the following guidelines:




